



That same quality is now set for improvement at an upcoming furnace rebuilding scheduled for 2022, for which specifications will include the same furnace size as well as a higher melting capacity thanks to stronger boosting. tion of furnace geometry and design will cut emissions still further, especially those of NOx - reduced here by SORG's cutting edge technology of control and regulation combined with another installation for compressed air injection.
